Dear Mary:

This letter shall serve as a Grant Agreement between the California Emerging Technology Fund (CETF) and the West Contra Costa County Unified School District (WCCUSD) for CETF to award a grant of \$25,000 to WCCUSD to match and support implementation of the grants you received from Sprint to increase home broadband access for WCCUSD students and their families. CETF appreciates your leadership and the commitment by WCCUSD to harness the power of computing technologies and high-speed Internet access to help improve academic performance as part of a comprehensive set of strategies to achieve education excellence. We value the partnership we have had with WCCUSD to implement School2Home at DeJean Middle School over the last 3 years. As you know, CETF is providing significant additional funding to transition full responsibility for School2Home (or its functional equivalencies) to WCCUSD and DeJean for the coming school year.

This \$25,000 grant provides additional support for your following purposes:

- Assistance with implementation of the Sprint grants, including kicking off your fundraising efforts and working with DeJean Middle School to provide priority opportunities for DeJean families to receive Sprint hotspots from the non-age-restricted grant.
- Distribution of information about other available affordable broadband offers (given that there will not be enough Sprint devices to reach all WCCUSD students from low-income households). CETF will designate personnel to work with you to customize information for your use.
- Collaboration on collecting information and evaluating the impacts from distribution of the Sprint hotspots and information about other affordable offers to refine future efforts to promote broadband adoption.

You may not use any CETF funds to carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation within the meaning of the Code of Federal Regulations, Internal Revenue Service, Department of the Treasury Section 53.4945(d)(1).

As a grantee, you shall not be covered by any CETF employer benefits, workers' compensation or other insurance policies. You shall indemnify and hold harmless CETF, its present and future officers, directors, trustees, employees and agents to the fullest extent by law for any and all claims, liabilities, losses and expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) directly, indirectly, wholly or partially arising from or in connection with any negligent act or omission by you.

WCCUSD and CETF shall consult one another and coordinate any public announcements about this agreement or release of any information about the impacts and results of this grant.

All deliverables and products developed as a result of this agreement shall become the shared intellectual property of WCCUSD and CETF.

If this agreement is acceptable to you, please sign and return to CETF. We look forward to continuing to work together to close the Digital Divide for the students and families in West Contra Costa Unified School District.
