



WCCUSD Summer 2016 ELA




 Students in grades 2 to 6 who took both assessments showed increases ranging from 14-27% in their reading scores.

WCCUSD Summer 2016 Science




Mastered: Meets or Exceeds Standard (>70%)









Elementary Expanded Learning (After School) Program Highlights



Students served: 644



- Daily snacks and hot supper
- Daily instruction in ELA, STEM, Performing and Visual Arts
- In partnership with food bank over 4,000 pounds of free produce distributed weekly to families
- Culminating family events



Secondary Program (Grades 7-12)

Middle school: 1.5 hours instruction in ELA/ELD, Math, Science

- Standards-based ELA and Math: blended learning using Plato and direct instruction
- Hands-on science exploration: Lawrence Hall of Science FOSS

High school: Two 3-hour blocks of instruction for recovery of 10 credits. Seniors participated in Independent Study for recovery of up to 20 credits.

















Secondary ELD Levels 1 and 2 Inside Curriculum for MS




Pre-College Trio Programs: Upward Bound, Upward Bound Math & Science, Talent Search

- Students were enrolled in a mathematics course as well as a science or humanities course





HHS Algebra IPre/Post-Assessment Data

Student Survey Results






Parent Survey Results
